

This quilt is based on a log cabin block. A traditional log cabin block's center square is red or yellow, denoting the fire or light in the home. There is a story that during slavery days, quilters made black center blocks and when hung outside, the quilt indicated that this home was a stop on the Underground Railroad. Using that as inspiration, Julie's quilt will have black, rainbow, brown and pink center blocks indicating support for Black lives, the LGBTQ+ community, immigrants and women. Our Social Media presence is on Facebook and Instagram. We removed our Twitter/X account when the terms and conditions no longer aligned with our mission. I know there are other social media accounts out there (Blue Sky and Threads as well as others), and they will be assessed accordingly.

Social Media functions on algorithms. In order for Spencer Pride to thrive online, we need everyone's support.

How can you do this? Here are some simple ways you can boost Spencer Pride on Social Media, without leaving the comfort of your chair.





Did you know that the first penny press (a.k.a. a penny smashing machine) debuted at the Chicago's World Fair in 1893? Since that time these unique machines have popped up around the world and are highly sought by tourists and collectors alike. What does a penny smashing machine do? Well, it should come as no surprise that it smashes pennies. It does so while also imprinting a special design into the coin. Children of all ages love to crank the handle and feel the pressure build as the penny is compressed and imprinted.

Spencer Pride is proud to host Owen County's only penny smashing machine, which has arrived just in time for the eclipse! The Spencer Pride machine features 5 designs, each featuring a special place in Spencer. The penny smashing machine was sponsored in part by Babbs, the Historic Tivoli Theatre, McCormick's Creek State Park, and Sweet Owen Convention & Visitors Bureau. Each coin takes 4 quarters and one penny (just \$1.01 for an awesome souvenir!).


